STATEMENT

The starting point of much of my work is informed by the primal nature of my raw materials, and the alchemy of the felt making process itself. Wool fibres, water and soap are combined to transform into a fabric which can be shrunk into tactile forms through a long and physical process, the wool memorising the form as it dries. The idea of the wool "remembering' provides me with the means to ritually mark and process events in my life; the felt acting as a holding depository for my experiences. My intricate costumes and body adornments are a physical expression of my interest in the nature of our human condition, concepts of self, and loss of a sense of sacredness in the modern world, and hint of ritual practices, archetypes and tribal art.
